Airport Bus

The *Oxford Airline* is a very comfortable and frequent coach service which serves Heathrow, Gatwick and Birmingham airports. Featuring free wi-fi, this service is both comfortable and reasonably priced.

Airport Taxi Transfer

Trains from London

For those travelling to Oxford from London, trains run frequently between London Paddington and Oxford train station with an average journey time of around an hour. From Oxford train station it is a 15 minute walk into the city centre. Alternatively buses serving various areas of the city can be caught in front of station.

Coaches from London

The *Oxford Tube* is a convenient and efficient service which departs every 10 minutes from multiple locations in Oxford and London. The journey usually takes around 1 hour and 40 minutes. With a letter of enrolment issued by OISE Oxford, students are eligible for discounted travel on this service.
