



Travel to Bristol

Bristol is the largest city in the South West of England and has excellent transport links to London and other major cities in the UK.

Travel by Air



The nearest airport is Bristol Airport which is located approximately 30 minutes from the city centre by road and there are currently flights to Bristol from approximately 17 different countries in Europe. London Heathrow is approximately 2 hours from Bristol and Gatwick is almost 3 hours away, but you can travel to Bristol Bus Station by National Express Coach www.nationalexpress.com/ from Heathrow or Gatwick and also by train to Bristol Temple Meads Railway Station. If you prefer, we

can arrange for a taxi to collect you from arrival airport and take you to your homestay, hotel or any other destination of your choice in Bristol. The Airport Express Link <http://flyer.bristolairport.co.uk/> (also known as The Bristol Flyer) operates a regular service from Bristol Airport to Bristol Bus Station (with several stops along the way) at a very reasonable cost. It is also possible to take your own taxi from the taxi rank outside the airport at a cost of approximately £25 - £30, depending on your destination in the city.



Travel by Train



Eurostar trains arrive at London St. Pancras railway station at regular intervals and are a fast and comfortable alternative to air travel if you prefer. We can arrange for a taxi to collect you from St. Pancras and bring you to Bristol if you wish, but there is a fast and regular train service to Bristol Temple Meads railway station from London Paddington station. There is a taxi rank outside Bristol Temple Meads station and several buses also stop outside the station entrance.

Travel by Car

If you would like to bring your car to Bristol, you can travel to the UK by ferry. There are several large ports on the South Coast of England which may be a convenient option for you. Hotels sometimes offer free parking for their guests, but if you have chosen the homestay or private accommodation option, it will probably be possible to park in the street where you live. Parking in Bristol City Centre is very limited and can be expensive.
