ACADEMIC EXPERIENCE

Key points

Small class sizes ensure that each student receives individual attention from their tutors, providing a learning experience which is unique to their needs. Academic programme

Unlike traditional language courses designed to teach the mechanics of the language as an end in itself, the Scholar English programme provides language development through an all-encompassing school programme delivered in English. The aim of the course is to develop the child's education in English, to expand their knowledge via the medium of English and encourage them to form their own opinions, in English.

Programme content

Grammar and pronunciation are embedded throughout all lessons. The programme includes a rich variety of content including:

workshops in creative writing
guidance in essay writing
journalism workshops
biographies
debates
Book Club
career subject tasters
guided research projects with presentations
group discussions
eloquence 'walkshops'
training in philosophical thinking, etc.

Option: Intensive Exam Skills

For students who are interested to prepare for an English language exam, there is the option to take the Exam Preparation option. These programmes teach exam strategies for the IELTS English exam, the Cambridge B2 (first)

English exam and the Cambridge C1 (CAE) English exam. The programmes provide extensive practice tests with feedback against mark schemes so that pupils feel confident going into the exam. Pupils also have dedicated language lessons to ensure they cover the exam vocabulary and grammar. The exam strategies which are taught, help students to navigate the exam with ease and to understand the requirements of the exam, allowing them to approach the exam with confidence and achieve the best results.

EXPECTATIONS

Course outcomes

- Language: students gain the ability to speak and write in English with confidence and accuracy, whilst feeling comfortable using the language.
- Personal development: students increase their self-assurance.
- Cultural awareness: students gain a cultural awareness that is useful to them in their further studies and higher education.
- Academic subjects: students gain foundation knowledge of a wide range of academic subjects which helps students to choose pathways in their further higher education.

ACCOMMODATION

Residence at Newbury

Students stay in single study bedrooms, each with a private bathroom.

The school is equipped with fire and burglar alarms as well as CCTV. At 22:00, the main gate is locked, and the main entrance of the residence and the corridors are alarmed, to prevent students from entering other student's corridors at night. Students will each have their own key card which lets them enter the residence building and only their own room. There is a safe in the school office in which students can keep any valuables they wish.

All meals are prepared daily using quality, fresh ingredients from local suppliers to deliver a well balanced and varied menu of dishes. Meat, fresh fruit and vegetables are delivered daily to ensure quality and freshness. Fruit is always available as well as milk, hot drinks for the morning and afternoon break. In the evenings we also have fruit, milk, hot drinks plus biscuits and other snacks available. The chef and catering team are trained to cater for all dietary needs and requirements, including food allergies and religious food restrictions.

The town of Newbury

Newbury is an historic market town about an hour from London and also within easy reach of Oxford, Winchester and Bath. Dating from the 11th century, the town has a population of around 30,000 and boasts a beautiful town centre with a picturesque canal and superb facilities including a wide range of shops, cafes and restaurants. In addition there is a modern local cinema, excellent theatres and a whole host of sporting opportunities.

Arrival/departure transfers - Shuttle service

On arrival days, a shuttle is scheduled to leave for the school at the following times:

- · Gatwick airport: 18.00;
- · Heathrow airport: 18.00;
- · St. Pancras: 18.00

Students should choose a flight/ train that lands / arrives 90 minutes before the shuttle departure. They should also be aware that the earlier they arrive the longer their wait at the airport/station. A representative will be at the airport or station 6 hours before the departure of the shuttle to welcome the students and provide assistance.

On departure days, a shuttle will drop the students at the following time:

- · Gatwick airport: 11.30;
- · Heathrow airport: 11.30;
- · St. Pancras: 11.30

Students should choose a flight or train that departs at least 2 hours after the above drop off times. They should also be aware that the later the flight the longer the wait. A representative will stay at the airport or the station 5 hours after the arrival of the shuttle to provide assistance while waiting to go through the departures gate.

For arrival transfer outside of the times of the Shuttle Service

For any students who require a transfer service at a time or on a date other than those served by the OISE Shuttle service, OISE will provide contact details of a local taxi service so that the student can arrange a personal taxi meeting service directly with the taxi provider.

CULTURE

Sample day

A full day of intensive English learning

The course lessons take place from 0900 hrs to 1700 hrs from Monday to Friday.

In addition, the day includes homework sessions in which the student can prepare content for upcoming lessons. Each morning and afternoon includes a break in which students can relax and help themselves to refreshments.

The school offers plenty of quiet spaces in which students can do personal work and reading.

The course includes extra-curricular activities such as full-day excursions, social evenings, quiz nights, movie nights and hobby clubs.

Freedoms and permissions: pupils will not be allowed to leave the school premises or leave the group during activities unsupervised, unless they are over 14 and the school has received parental consent. The full supervision and curfew policy is available on request.

The level of supervision is structured to keep every pupil safe: the accommodation is attached to the teaching building within the same fenced grounds. (with security gate). Throughout the stay, pupils enjoy a high staff/student ratio: the minimum of one adult to 15 pupils is often increased up to 10 and
